WEEK 1

Course Details

- Course Dates: February 21-25, March 21-25, April 11-15, 2011
- Organisation: The course starts each week at 12.00 on Mondays and runs to 17.00 on Fridays. Days are organised in five sessions of classes and group work of 90 minutes each and include evening and home work.
- Location: The first week will be held at the Novotel in Cannes and the second and third week at the Radisson Blu in Nice.
- Tuition Fee: The course fee is 10800 €. The fee for participants from government agencies or academia is 7600 €. The fee is charged at registration and participation is confirmed when payment is received. A discount of 1000 € is offered for early registration (prior to October 31, 2010). Participation is limited to ~24.
- Accommodation: Accommodation and conference costs are not included in the course fee. The cost of accommodation is 1850 € (4 nights per week), and cost of the conference package is 1700 € (including all meals). Accommodation and conference costs are payable at registration.
- Cancellation: The tuition fee and hotel deposit will be refunded in the case of cancellations until 2 months prior to the course. An administrative fee of 200€ will however be charged. In the case of a cancellation less than 2 month before the course, the fee will not be refunded, but can be credited to the program of the following year. In the case of cancellations less than 14 days prior to the course, payments will only be credited to the next year if a participant can be replaced.
